The Vestry serves as the church's board of directors and governs the business of the parish. Vestry membership includes 12 adult lay leaders, one youth representative, the rector, and parish officers. Led by the rector and wardens, the Vestry represents the congregation in every area of decision-making and welcomes ideas and feedback at any time.

Members are elected to three-year terms at the parish annual meeting in January; the nonvoting youth representative serves for one year. Vestry candidates must be confirmed, provide financial support to the parish with an annual pledge, and have been members of the parish for a minimum of six months.






#### **BOOK STUDY:**



Thursday, January 30, 4-8 a.m. Interfaith Community Services (550 W. Washington Ave., Escondido, CA 92025)



### **Candlemas Service**


Sunday, February 2, 4 p.m., Sanctuary
